You may recall from earlier newsletters that, during the Mobberley Scarecrow Competition in 2014, two of the entries were entered into the McCain's national competition and that Mrs Ellison and family's entry, The Scarecrow Farm Shop, won the national prize.



The prize was £5,000 which was to be spent on a community project. After much deliberation, Mobberley Parish Council thought the most appropriate way to spend the funds would be to mark the centenary of the commencement of WW1. And as the Victory Hall is such an iconic building in the village, and so much work is being done to improve the building, the carving would enhance both the village and the Victory Hall.

To mark the arrival of the carving, Mobberley Parish Council is organising an afternoon tea at the Victory Hall on Saturday 16 May. We hope Mrs Ellison and family will attend and cut a ribbon at 2pm, officially marking the arrival of the carving. The Spirito concert team has devised another sparkling **Spring Concert fund-raiser on Saturday 16 May** ... with a lively and delightfully engaging performance featuring Lithuanian pianist and gold-medal winner, Ugnius Pauliukonis, alongside the explosive and captivating world folk-fusion talents of Project Jam Sandwich.

As ever, you can expect a diverse and packed programme: this year, Spirito takes in Ravel, Debussy and Rachmaninov before a 40-minute journey around the globe in the company of five highly accomplished young musicians who met while studying at the Royal Northern College of Music (RNCM). They comprise a dynamic collaboration of instruments (guitar, violin, double bass, cello, percussion), and bring a host of musical styles and genres. Project Jam Sandwich will take us on a refreshing hop through the sounds and traditions of Cuba, South Africa, Ireland and more.

Ugnius Pauliukonis has won numerous national and international competitions, and he has participated in various festivals around the country, including Ribchester and the Lake District Summer Music Festival. Next season he will make his début at the Bridgewater Hall ... so see him first with us!



The members of Project Jam Sandwich are also rising stars, having



appeared already on Radio 3. They will be featured artists in this year's RNCM Day of Strings, Percussion and Chamber Music Festivals. The band has also been invited to play at a number of prestigious events including Swaledale Festival (Top 10 UK Festivals – The Guardian) and Fishguard International Music Festival. Project Jam Sandwich champions outreach playing, and their music-making is energetic and accessible. Working as 'Live Music Now' artists (founded by Yehudi Menuhin), they regularly bring live music to all sorts of audiences who would not usually have access to it, including those in special needs schools, hospitals and prisons.

This year's Spirito event opens with a touching poem and singing presented by pupils from Mobberley Primary School, in a special reflection on the events of WW1.

The venue is to be the wonderfully refurbished St John's Parish Church in Knutsford on Saturday 16 May. 7pm arrivals for a prompt 7.30pm start. Cash bar.

Mobberley Victory Hall Trust Deed Committee

Message from the TDC's Chairperson:

The TDC sat on 21 April, at which we discussed the results of two new sub-groups of the committee whose members have been discussing the daily management of the site and how we improve our marketing of the facilities. We also discussed the recommendations of a recent timber survey, which highlighted a number of issues. These will need prioritisation and creative thought around the cost of remedial work.



This leads me onto the recent addition of the First World War monument on the site. The carving is a striking and moving memorial to the sacrifice of the people of Mobberley during two world wars. On behalf of the TDC, I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate the Parish Council for its work in delivering a new local landmark.

While admiring the carving last week and taking a strong sense of permanence from its thoughtful positioning, I thought that we have a long way to go to ensure that the backdrop to the carving – our Victory Hall – receives the TLC and cash it deserves to guarantee its place in the future.

To do this, we will need more people from all walks of life in our community to use the Hall for meetings and functions. If you have any ideas, time or skills that you can offer the Victory Hall site, please call me on 874014.

World Book Day initiative

To celebrate World Book Day in March, 14 volunteers from different areas of the airport, Tatton Park and Cheshire East (Knutsford support group) visited schools in Knutsford and Mobberley. The purpose of the visits was to encourage the children to read books and develop reading skills from an early age in order to secure their dream job in the future.



Pupils at Manor Park, Knutsford and Mobberley Primary schools heard about the many different types of jobs available in the area and about the importance of literacy in the workplace.

The volunteers read their chosen books to the classes, following which was a chat and questions about their story. This linked to the important theme of literacy, which is that reading is important regardless of what children want to do when they are older.

Retailer WHSmith, which has shops in all three airport terminals, supported the initiative by donating enough £1 World Book Day books for each child at each school to take home and keep. A donation of £75 Achievement Reward Vouchers were also given to each school to help boost their library resources.

Snooker. League matches are played every Tuesday and Thursday night from 8pm. Some Wednesdays have competitions; see the noticeboard for details.


