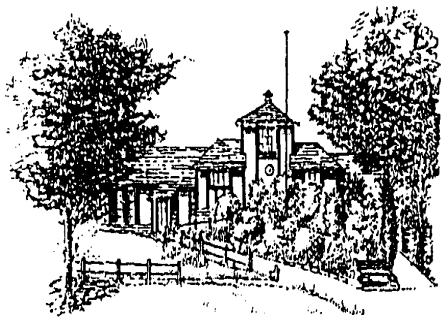

Village Pride Committee Meeting Minutes Tuesday 14th December 2021 at 19:00

Agenda:

1. **Apologies for absence:** Alistair MacLeod, Parish Ranger.
2. **To note any declaration(s) of interest:** None
3. **To approve and sign the minutes of the meeting on 8th November 2021:** The minutes were approved and signed.
4. **Budget 2021/22 and Budget Planning:** It was agreed that any money left-over from the 2021 budget will be put into the earmarked fund for the Christmas tree lighting project which would also include installing lighting at the coat of arms at Beech Hill.
120 Christmas tree saplings have been purchased for the Community Meadow which will be planted early in the New Year.
The 2022 budget breakdown was discussed and the money would be allocated to:
£1,000 for the Christmas tree if a sponsor can't be found, £200 for the flag pole maintenance, £150 for the poppy blanket backing, £300 lamppost poppies, £200 for village Christmas decorations, £4,500 for projects.
5. **Jubilee celebrations:** Initial plans were discussed. It was suggested to liaise with the Rose Queen Committee and see whether they could put all their equipment up the week before the Rose Queen Festival so that the stage and seating could be utilized for the jubilee celebrations. The stage would have live music with food stalls, or bring a picnic. Cllr Kendall will liaise with the Rose Queen members.
It was agreed that the pubs would be approached about the potential for a Saturday evening event. Cllr Kendall will liaise with the Station Inn, Cllr Baker will speak with the Roebuck, the Bull and the Church Inn. The pubs would be approached to see whether they would consider funding the minibus between the pubs for the evening.
6. **Victory Hall 100 Years:** One suggestion was that a wedding fayre could take place at the Victory Hall with money spent on advertising. This would advertise the Victory Hall as a wedding venue. The Parish Ranger could have a stand with information about the history of the Victory Hall. It was agreed to approach the TDC with this and also make them aware to be mindful that the 100-year anniversary falls in wedding season. If the TDC feel that they would rather accept a wedding booking then the other option is to book it out for a wedding and the Parish Council will put a piece in the newsletter about the anniversary. Cllr Holloway will speak to the TDC at their next meeting in January.
7. **Flower Tubs:** This would be carried over to the next meeting depending on whether money was left for replanting.
8. **Railway Station:** Three rail passes have been issued for visits to other railway stations. Grey and blue are the colours in place for the next five years for any station redecorating. Nothing further to update.
9. **Competitions:** Christmas light competition – last years' winners are going to judge the competition. Prizes will then be issued.
Next year a summer competition will take place along with the Christmas lights.
An auction will take place next year for the bee stones that were painted for the Arena Bombing Memorial competition. It was agreed to communicate with the school in the New Year to see whether they would like to

make a bug hotel or to plant some wildflowers on the Community Meadow as a way of marking the anniversary.
