

MOBBERLEY, GREAT WARFORD AND CHORLEY

An unusual (small) book dating to 1848 has come to light after Veryan Leycester-Roxby found it in some of her father's papers in Toft. It measures only 4" x 3" but is titled 'PLANS AND REFERENCE TO THE ESTATE OF RALPH GERARD LEYCESTER, ESQ'. It comprises 27 plans for each of the properties owned by the Leycester family at that time, mainly in Mobberley but also Chorley and Great Warford. It is not in very good condition although the pages which show in detail the map of each property and its fields alongside a list of their 'Quantities in Statute Measure' as well as 'Cheshire Measure' are clear, albeit in miniature.



Ralph Leycester of Tabley came into the possession of Toft Hall in the 14th century through marriage and the Leycester family became significant landowners in Mobberley. The Cheshire Tithe Maps from the 1830s (free to view on-line) show Ralph Gerard Leycester as one of the four significant owners of land in Mobberley, the other three being the Peter Legh of Booths (mainly the southwestern part), Wilbraham Egerton of Tatton (mainly the north-west) and the estate of the late Thomas Wright.

Over the years the Mobberley properties have been sold off and Veryan manages what remains of the Toft Estate. But in 1848 amongst the nineteen Mobberley properties and their surrounding fields were Town Lane Hall and much of the fields and properties along the north of Town Lane, the Roebuck and its surrounds, Grimsditch Farm in Damson Lane, Smith Lane Farm and much of the land to the east of Smith Lane, Heald House (now Wee Bridge Farm off Slade Lane), Owen House Farm, Woodend, Stockinghey, Hollin Gee on Burleyhurst Lane, Lindow House at the end of Paddock Hill and several parts of the Paddock Hill area.

Veryan inherited the estate from her father Edmund Leycester-Roxby who in had also inherited from his uncle Cyril Leycester Maude Roxby who died in 1942 and in turn from his uncle Rafe Oswald Leycester who died in 1929 having no children.

The plan is to look at restoring the book or at least halting its deterioration and scanning the pages to make them available on-line for those interested of which more in the Parish Newsletter in future.








MANCHESTER AIRPORT

Following the easing of travel restrictions on 11th February, passenger numbers continue to grow at Manchester Airport. To allow for the additional flight movements, the airport is set to reopen Runway Two from Tuesday 5th April.

Initially it will operate for a limited number of hours each day and will gradually increase as the demand continues to rise.

Karen Smart, Managing Director of Manchester Airport, said:

"After almost two years of closure, it is a positive step forward on the road to recovery to be able to reopen Runway Two.

"It's a clear sign of the pent-up demand there is from our passengers and the eagerness to travel now restrictions have been eased further.

Notification of Runway Closure 2022

As you may be aware, our existing Runway, Runway 1 (05L/23R) is our primary runway and has been used solely for operations during the Pandemic where we have been operating with severely restricted aircraft movements.

Each year maintenance work is required to maintain Runway 1, the most used runway, and its' adjoining taxiways. We publish dates of the nights when Runway 1 will be closed;

Your Farmers need your help!

Did you know that dog poo has an infectious disease called Neosporosis in it, which can cause cattle to abort? This year there have been a number of cattle harmed by dog's faeces that has infected what is ultimately their food, whether it has been grazed or cut for silage. Dog poo needs to be picked up and disposed of where it cannot become part of the food chain.

On our farm alone, 4 of our cows have lost their pregnancies and have tested positive for neosporosis so far. It is very sad as we care deeply for our cows and it takes years of hard work and breeding to ensure a quality herd. However, once they have neosporosis, cows can no longer be used for breeding as this infection can be passed on to their young.

Since we have learned of these 4 cows, we have discovered that we need to test the rest of the female herd at huge cost to the farm, which is far from ideal.

This is just one of the many reasons why it's so important to stick to the signposted footpaths and keep your dog by your side, so that you can see when they poo and pick it up. Ensuring you stick to footpaths also significantly reduces damage to crops and grass (which is a crop). Hundreds of people may use a footpath each day and you would be amazed by how much damaged can be caused to non-designated land.



Personally, I love to see people enjoy the countryside and I am always willing to answer questions or discuss this issue in more detail. In fact, farming can be a very lonely job so you may give me a well-deserved break. To most, a field is a field, but to us it's our livelihoods and we would appreciate your help in reducing infections in cattle and damage to our crops. Many Thanks Ian Norbury Mobberley Angus






