

Never fails to amaze me how quickly new life begins once we start to enter February and March. The bulbs are popping through and early trees are starting to bud. We at the council are planning on creating some floral displays in the village this year. Firstly starting with our Station project. We are responsible for the upkeep of Mobberley Station, we have a volunteering day planned for Saturday March 11th, 11am-2pm, please email <u>clerk@mobberleyparishcouncil.co.uk</u> if you want to come and take part. Please bring some gardening tools with you. Once this is all tidy we have 6 half whisky barrel planters to line each side of the platform. We will be planting these with some seasonal perennials to add all year round colour. We also have 4 more planters which we have plans for around the village, so keep an eye out for them popping up full of colour. Our Village Events committee met last month, lots of ideas were discussed and we have put together a full list of the events we have chosen to do this year. Mobberley Primary School

25 children aged 8 to 11 took part in the Young Voices concert at the AO arena along with 8500 others. Children sang and performed to an audience of 20 000 and had the time of their lives!

All children took part in eco workshops, focusing on reusing and recycling. Children in EYFS and KS1 made an eco fish using colourful scales made out of newspapers and magazines. Children in KS2 made their own notebook out of maps and old paper. During Children's Mental Health week, everyone 'dressed to impress', wearing bright colours to show off how unique and confident they are. Lessons were spent thinking about our connections to other people and how we can be kind to each other. We also launched our new weekly kindness awards, catching children in who have shown kindness to one another.

For storytelling week, children were surprised with a secret visitor who read them a story. Each class had someone new read them a story, listening to books like 'George's Marvellous Medicine' and 'Rainbow Fish'. They also had the opportunity to buy a book from the 'Pre-Loved' book sale which meant every child took home a book. The Sports Ambassadors and Sports Captains from Years 5 and 6 took part in Sports Leader's training. They learnt leadership skills; started a sports blog for the website; and created games to lead at lunchtimes with the infant and junior children. Children in Year 4 had their Level 1 Bikeability training, learning basic skills on the playground. Year 5 had their Level 2 training where they went out on local, quiet roads to practise road safety.

In Reception, children were visited by Mr Johnston who told them all about his job as a pilot. Their current topic is travel and transport so they enjoyed learning all about planes and got to see him fly over the school the next day!

The Young Leaders in Year 6 have been working together to come up with some fundraising ideas for the Turkey/Syria Earthquake appeal. Lots of ideas were had by all! Finally, the whole school enjoyed a visit from the Pop Project who got the children singing and dancing. They thought about happiness and discussed ideas such as developing a positive mindset, building character, the importance of sleep and following new interests and hobbies. We all love it when the Pop Project come to visit and look forward to it every year!






