

We have seen an increase in concerns around passing horse riders on our country lanes. We wanted to remind everyone of the changes made to the Highway Code.

Last year, the Highway Code changed to detail how drivers should manage situations involving animals, this is as follows:

Rule 214

Animals: When passing animals, drive slowly. Give them plenty of room and be ready to stop. Do not scare animals by sounding your horn, revving your engine or accelerating rapidly once you have passed them. Look out for animals being led, driven or ridden on the road and take extra care. Keep your speed down at bends and on narrow country roads. If a road is blocked by a herd of animals, stop and switch off your engine until they have left the road. Watch out for animals on unfenced roads.

Rule 215

Horse riders and horse-drawn vehicles. Be particularly careful of horse riders and horse-drawn vehicles especially when approaching, overtaking, passing or moving away. Always pass wide and slowly. When you see a horse on a road, you should slow down to a MAXIMUM OF 10 mph. Be patient, do not sound your horn or rev your engine. WHEN SAFE TO DO SO, PASS WIDE AND SLOW, ALLOWING AT LEAST 2 METRES OF SPACE

Horse riders are often children, so take extra care and remember riders may ride in double file when escorting a young or inexperienced horse or rider. Look out for horse riders' and horse drivers' signals and heed a request to slow down or stop. Take great care and treat all horses as a potential hazard; they can be unpredictable, despite the efforts of their rider/driver. Remember there are three brains at work when you pass a horse; the rider's, the driver's and the horse's. Do not forget horses are flight animals and can move incredibly quickly if startled

INSPIRING WOMEN

Mobberley Primary School

The Reception Class children used our Forest School area for the first time. They enjoyed investigating the area, hunting for mini beasts and hiding in the dens. We've also had some exciting developments with a duck that has laid eggs in the wooded area. Maybe we will have a school duckling! Children in Years 1, 2, 5 and 6 have also enjoyed using the new Forest School area — learning how to use tools like bushcraft knives, hammers, peelers and a carpenter's brace. They have lit fires, cooked food, climbed trees, hunted for bugs and got very muddy!

Reception also had a recent 'animal wow day' - this was to introduce their new animal topic. The children made an animal biscuit, had their faces painted, brought in an animal cuddly toy and played lots of animal themed games.

Children in Year 1 have been doing lots of planting for their Science topic – lettuce, radish, cress and sunflowers, as well as planting wild flowers around the school grounds.

Year 4 have started their curriculum swimming lessons at Knutsford Leisure this term. All children are thoroughly enjoying it and making a splash! They have also been on a trip to the Deva Roman Discovery Centre where they learnt about the Ancient Roman city of Chester. They even got to chant some Roman phrases down the streets of Chester with a sword and shield!

Year 5 created an Anglo Saxon village with 3D models made by themselves. They researched to make them as realistic as possible.




We are looking forward to the Summer months, with trips and sports day on the horizon!
